Travelling with a raised boom


Background

On Thursday 6th January 2022, an FPC contractor's forwarder has been commuting between cells, with its boom in a raised upright position.

The boom has struck the overhanging limb of a standing marri, which at its base, was rotten.

The tree, as it fell has slid down the boom arm and become lodged in-between the cab and log bunker.

Fortunately, there were no injuries.



Key Points

- The operator was travelling with the machines boom raised, whereas it should have been in a horizontal position.
- The operator was aware of the overhang and has misjudged its height in relation to the boom.
- The tree had been marked for retention as a habitat tree.
- It is unknown if at the time of tree marking the tree was identifiable as a potential hazard, but ongoing, if there are concerns of overhanging trees on access roads these should be reported.
- Highlights the importance of appropriate, compliant, and maintained machine guarding which should never be taken for granted.
